- **Relaxed Formula Guests:** Enjoy a traditional local meal featuring regional specialties or take part in other culinary and cultural highlights that offer an authentic taste of island life.

This flexible approach allows you to enjoy your stay exactly as you prefer — whether actively exploring or simply relaxing and savoring the experience.



Saturday, February 21, 2026

Arrival



The bus takes us from the sunny south of Gran Canaria directly to the port of Las Palmas. There, an impressive crossing awaits us aboard the Fred Olsen catamaran, which gently carries us across the Atlantic to Morro Jable, at the southern tip of Fuerteventura.

Upon arrival at the port, a comfortable coach is already waiting to take us to the elegant **Hotel H10 Playa Esmeralda Palace** — one of the island's most exquisite accommodations, offering an exceptional location and outstanding service that leaves nothing to be desired.

In the evening, we enjoy a warm welcome gathering at the hotel, where we also greet guests who have arranged their own arrival.



Sunday, February 22, 2026
To the roots of the island



Our day begins with a visit to the historic **Salinas del Carmen** in Caleta de Fuste, where we learn about traditional salt production. We then continue to the archaeological site of **La Atalaya**. During a guided tour of the remains of this pre-Hispanic settlement, we delve into the lives of the Berber tribes and gain deeper insight into their culture and traditions.



Guests on the “Fuerteventura Relaxed” Program:

Guests on the *Fuerteventura Relaxed* program spend their lunch break in the picturesque fishing village of **Pozo Negro**. In one of the two charming beachfront bars, it's all about delicious **tapas**, fresh seafood, and enjoying the view of the sea. After lunch, the journey continues to **Gran Tarajal**, the island's second-largest town. Here, there's time to explore the lively promenade, relax in cozy cafés, stroll along the beach, or simply soak in the laid-back atmosphere.



Guests on the “Fuerteventura Active” Program:

The program for guests who have chosen the *Fuerteventura Active Formula* promises an unforgettable blend of adventure and natural wonders. The tour begins in the striking black lava field of Pozo Negro and leads us into a **spectacular cliff** landscape. On this unique hike, we cross a younger lava field and explore the raw, fascinating formations shaped by volcanic activity. Along the way, breathtaking views open up over remote beaches and golden mini-coves, where the turquoise water shimmers in the sunlight. A particularly memorable section is the crossing of lava platforms that once flowed in cascades from the Caldera de Jacomar, creating a captivating geological landscape. Our destination is the secluded **fishing village of Jacomar**, accessible only on foot or by boat. There, we are welcomed by the tranquility of an authentic place, far removed from tourist crowds.





Monday, February 23, 2026

Cofete: The Last Outpost of Civilization and Gateway to the Desert



On this tour, we discover the stunning diversity of Fuerteventura's landscapes. The island stretches about 98 kilometers in length and is geographically made up of the main body, Maxorata, and the Jandía peninsula in the south. On the west coast of Jandía lies Playa de Barlovento—the complete opposite of the lively east coast: utterly untouched and often completely deserted. Our route takes us along a gravel track to **Cofete**. This remote hamlet, perched above the pristine, endless beach, is considered the last outpost of civilization on Fuerteventura. Beautiful beaches, a sand-covered abandoned cemetery, a charming chapel, rare native plants, and a rustic local bar — this wild tour is full of adventure!

Guests on the “Fuerteventura Relaxed” Program:

After a break at the bar in Cofete, we continue on to the Jandía Lighthouse and the fishing village of El Puertito, where a delicious **paella** awaits us. After lunch, we make a stop at the second **lighthouse**: El Faro de Morro Jable. Our final destination is the **Sotavento Beach**, famous for its turquoise lagoons — a perfect ending to a day filled with breathtaking landscapes and unforgettable experiences!





Guests on the “Fuerteventura Active” Program:



This adventurous coastal hike begins at the remote **Punta Pesebre**, where the smallest lighthouse in the Canary Islands proudly stands watch over the wild landscape. From the very start, the route exudes a rugged, untamed magic:

bizarre rock formations, sheer cliffs, and a narrow mountain path that winds like a lifeline along the coastal slopes. The trail demands a spirit of exploration and careful attention as it crosses weathered terrain, rewarding hikers with ever-changing breathtaking panoramas. The highlight awaits at the spectacular west coast: here, the imposing **Roque del Moro** rises boldly from the sea—a rock formation that stands unmistakably like a natural monument. This hike is made for trackers and nature lovers yearning for unspoiled beauty and a touch of adventure.





Tuesday, February 24, 2026
The Essence of Fuerteventura



To protect against pirates, the first island capital, **Betancuria**, was founded in an idyllic valley surrounded by imposing mountains over 700 meters high. Here, we delve deep into Fuerteventura's history as we visit the ruins of the Franciscan monastery and the impressive 15th-century Church of Santa María. A stroll through the charming, small old town completes this historically rich part of our journey.

Guests on the “Fuerteventura Relaxed” Program:

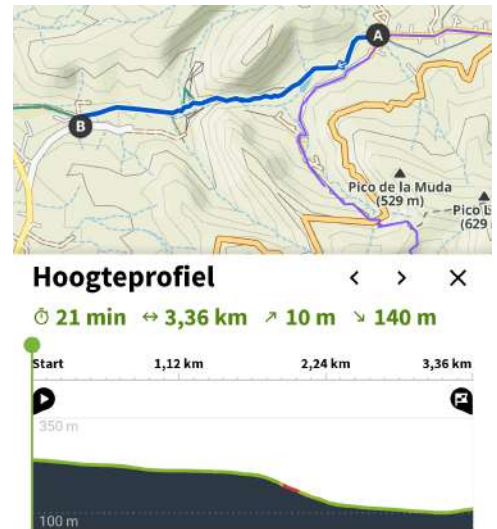
For guests on the “*Fuerteventura Relaxed Formula*” program, a special culinary experience awaits: a fine meal at a picturesque oasis restaurant in **Vega de Río Palmas**. Here, they will enjoy a delicious menu lovingly prepared with high-quality, typical products from the island — the Majoreros. After this delightful dining experience, the

bus takes them on to **Ajuy**, a charming fishing village on the west coast. Guests have free time to explore at their leisure. They can discover the impressive sea caves or simply relax in a bar, soaking in the peaceful atmosphere of this unique place.

For guests on the “Fuerteventura Active” program, a spectacular hike awaits through the impressive **Las Peñitas Gorge**. Surrounded by steep cliffs and untouched nature, the trail leads to one of the island’s hidden gems: **the pilgrimage church of the “Virgin of the Rock.”** This statue, revered as the patron saint of Fuerteventura, stands majestically amidst the striking landscape. It’s a unique opportunity to experience both the wild beauty of nature and the island’s deep spirituality. The bus picks up the hikers in Buen Paso and takes them to **Ajuy**, where they can explore the impressive sea caves!





Wednesday, February, 25, 2026

Fuerteventura's West



Our tour begins in the picturesque village of Agua de Bueyes, also known as the “Village of Three Lies.” Here, we visit an **aloe vera farm** and learn fascinating facts about this versatile medicinal plant, which thrives particularly well on the island thanks to its dry climate. Next, we continue to **Pájara**, a charming village featuring traditional Canarian architecture. A highlight here is the impressive local church, whose ornate façade captivates many visitors. Our next stop is the **Sicasumbre viewpoint**, a popular spot for spectacular vistas. From here, we enjoy an impressive panoramic view of the sacred mountain El Tanquito and the surrounding lunar landscape.

Guests on the “Fuerteventura Relaxed” Program:

For guests on the “*Fuerteventura Relaxed*” program, a visit to a **goat farm** is an absolute must! Fuerteventura without goats — and its famous goat cheese — is unimaginable! Here, we learn about the centuries-old tradition of goat herding on the island and the production of the renowned *Queso Majorero*, which has been awarded multiple times for its unique flavor. We experience the peaceful atmosphere of the farm, observe the charming goats up close, and may

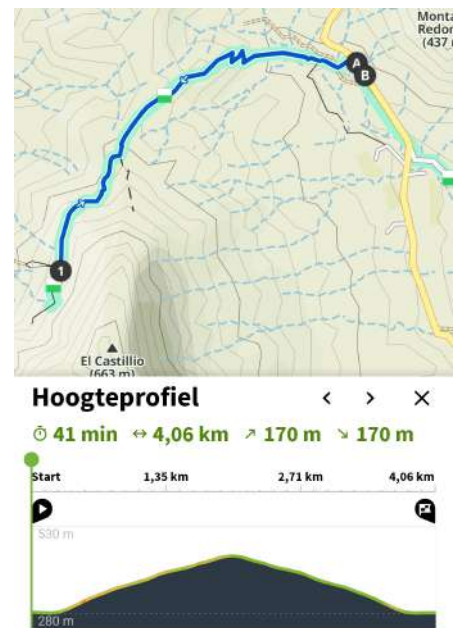


even get to sample this regional treasure. It's a true moment of indulgence that brings us closer to the island's culinary roots and traditions! The perfect finale is a visit to **La Pared Beach**, a wild bay with impressive, crashing waves. Here, nature lovers and surfers alike enjoy the stunning natural scenery.

Guests on the “Fuerteventura Active” Program:



This hike leads to the highest peaks of Maxorata, a part of Fuerteventura's wild and impressive hinterland. The destination is the legendary *Mahon*, a towering “giant” among the island's mountains and a place of spiritual significance. The trail winds through varied terrain, offering fantastic views of the rugged rocky landscapes along the way. The highlight is the pilgrimage site **Virgen del Tanquito**,



nestled like a hidden sanctuary within this captivating lunar landscape. The statue is revered as the region's patron saint and has drawn pilgrims and hikers for generations. To conclude, an unforgettable natural experience awaits: from here, hikers enjoy the **sunset over the west coast** as the light bathes the jagged cliffs

and sea in warm golden and red hues. A magical moment that deeply conveys the wild beauty and profound spirituality of this landscape.



Thursday, February 26, 2026

Isla de Lobos



Between Fuerteventura and Lanzarote lies the island of Lobos, one of the Canary Islands' last untouched natural paradises. The name "Lobos" comes from the sea lions (*lobos marinos*) that once inhabited the island. Today, the island is under strict protection and designated as a nature park. Upon arrival at the boat dock, we quickly step onto the circular trail. Our exploration of Lobos Island begins with a visit to the salt flats and the picturesque hamlet of Puertito. Here, the turquoise lagoons and the simple, traditional lifestyle of this small village leave a lasting impression.

Guests on the “Fuerteventura Active” program begin their hike exploring the island’s contrasting landscapes. The trail passes black lava fields and lush green vegetation, leading up to the Faro de Martiño lighthouse, which offers a breathtaking panoramic view of Lanzarote. The return route ends at **Playa de La Concha**, a stunning beach with soft white sand and crystal-clear waters!





Friday, February, 27, 2026

The Northwest

The day begins with a visit to the **lagoons** of El Cotillo, a true natural paradise renowned for its crystal-clear waters and idyllic landscapes. Next, we head to Popcorn Beach, named after the round, popcorn-like stones that cover the shore.



We continue on to **La Oliva**, where we tour



the historic **Casa de los Coroneles** — a magnificent example of Canary Islands architecture and a fascinating insight into the island's history. Our journey then takes us to the sacred Mount **Tindaya**, a prominent peak steeped in centuries-old spiritual significance and an important site in Canary Island mythology. We conclude the day with a **tapas menu at Los Molinillos**, the island's quietest and most charming bar. For the die-hards, there's an evening hike at sunset along the west coast!





Saturday, February, 28, 2026

Departure

After a week full of experiences and unforgettable impressions, it's time to slowly say goodbye to magical Fuerteventura. On the last day, we check out of the hotel around 12:00 pm and head to **Morro Jable**, the charming harbor town at the southern tip of the island. There's plenty of **free time** to enjoy the lively beach promenade at your own pace: stroll through small shops hunting for a last souvenir, treat yourself to a light lunch with sea views on a sunny terrace — or simply unwind once more with the sun, the sound of the waves, and the relaxed atmosphere of this picturesque coastal town. In the afternoon, we board the comfortable Fred Olsen catamaran ferry, which will safely and swiftly take us back to Gran Canaria. With our minds full of memories and our hearts filled with island spirit, we let this special journey gently come to a close.
