



Three-Day Hike in the Wild West of Gran Canaria

From Sunday, November 30, 2025, to Tuesday, December 02, 2025

A journey into the past through breathtakingly beautiful scenery!



Experience a three-day hike through the almost untouched Wild West of Gran Canaria. Discover wild nature, protected landscapes, and an atmosphere where time seems to stand still. Enjoy the beautiful weather and priceless views on this unforgettable three-day adventure!





**First stage:
Sunday, November 30, 2025**

Hike from Tasartico to La Aldea: A Colorful Natural Experience



We begin our three-day hike at the pass of Tasartico, where we're already treated to an impressive view over the La Aldea Valley. To the left lies the Güigüi Nature Reserve, and to the right, the imposing outer walls of the Tejeda

collapse crater. Rising above the Atlantic on the horizon is the majestic silhouette of the island of Tenerife. The trail leads us uphill to the Cruz de El Viso pass, through a dry pine forest. With every step, the view becomes broader and wilder. Already on the ascent, we feel the magic of the nearby Inagua Nature Reserve. The air is filled with the spicy scent of pine, and blossoms paint the landscape in vivid colors—just like the strikingly colorful rock layers that are so characteristic of this part of the island. This region is geologically the oldest on Gran Canaria. At the next pass, we descend into the rugged Pino Gordo Gorge. Along the way, we pass centuries-old almond trees and gaze into the deep canyon below. Eventually, we reach a fork that leads to the natural viewpoint El Blanquiza. At Blanquiza, it's all about color: green rock layers, red, purple—a petrified rainbow! The old *camino real* (royal path) then guides us to the most traditional town on the island: La Aldea de San Nicolás. There, we find rest and relaxation at Hotel La Aldea Suites—with a refreshing pool and cozy rooms, perfect for reflecting on the day's unforgettable experiences.





Second stage: Monday, December 01, 2025

Abandoned Hamlets Amid Colorful Palm Groves and Rugged Gorges



Our hike begins after a hearty breakfast. Following a picturesque route, we first pass a goat farm and then trace the path of the El Parralillo water channel. This canal leads us to one of Gran Canaria's hidden gems: the hamlet of Pino Gordo, nestled deep within the midsection of the dramatic Pino Gordo Gorge. Surrounded by lush palm groves, this secluded spot is accessible only on foot. The silent remains of old Canarian houses and terraced fields speak of a bygone era of traditional farming. Climbing to the next pass, we make our way through the Barranco de las Garrabateras, where colorful rock formations guide our path. We eventually reach the ghost village of Vigaroé, from where we are treated to breathtaking views of Gran Canaria's sacred mountains: Roque Nublo, Roque Bentayga, and


Roque Palmés. This area was once inhabited by pre-Hispanic communities, as evidenced by the many caves found here. In Vigaroé, the landscape reveals its full enchantment. Old fruit trees invite us to taste their offerings, while the silence and remoteness of the place create a truly special atmosphere. We continue our hike along the canyon floor, past clear pools and ancient cave dwellings, until we finally arrive at the El Caídero de la Niña reservoir. Here, at the end of our hike, our bus awaits to take us back to our "home away from home": La Aldea Suites!





**Third stage:
Tuesday, December 02, 2025**

Adventure in the Tamadaba Nature Park



After a hearty breakfast, the bus takes us to the forest house in Tamadaba Natural Park, where our hike begins. One of the day's highlights is undoubtedly the viewpoint at Llanos de la Mimbre, from which we can admire the impressive Risco Faneque and Gran Canaria's cliffs — the second highest cliffs in Europe. Majestically rising in the background is the neighboring island of Tenerife. The trail leads us through the moist pine forest to El Cortijo de Samsó, a historic site once inhabited by forest settlers. Their abandoned houses and a small church now lie hidden beneath the lush forest vegetation — a fascinating testament to times past. The path continues

downhill through the Agaete Gorge until we finally reach the Los Pérez reservoir, where the bus will be waiting for us. It will take us back to the southern part of the island as we reflect on the rich experiences of this diverse hiking day in Tamadaba.
